FIDIC DBO Format

Design - Construction - Long-term Operation One Contract and One Contractor One Performance Security, reducing (pro rata) at the end of the Retention Period

"green field" scenario :

a sequence of **Design – Build – Operate**

20 year Operation period





Advantages of DBO

- **Time**: Minimizing delays and optimizing construction activities
- Financial: Single point responsibility and long-term commitments
- Quality: Fitness for purpose and long-term reliability
- **Optimization of life-cycle costs**



Clause 1 - New Definitions

"Design-Build" and "Operation Service" "Cut-Off Date" "Cost plus Profit" "Financial Memorandum" "Licence Agreement" "Auditing Body"

"Commissioning Certificate"





Clause 8 - Time-Related provisions for the whole project

- Commencement Date
- Time for Completion
- Programme
- Delay Damages
- Contract Completion





Clause 9 - Provisions relating to Design-Build

Very similar to provisions in the Yellow Book Plus:

- 9.12 Completion of Design-Build
- 9.13 Failure to Complete





Clause 10 - Provisions relating to Operation Service

- General Requirements
- Commencement
- Licence Agreement
- Independent Compliance Audit
- Delivery
- Training
- Delays and Interruptions
- Failure to reach Production Outputs
- Completion of Operation Service





Licence Agreement

- The licence given to the Contractor to allow him to operate the Plant.
- Signed within 28 days of LoA
- Effective upon issue of Commissioning Certificate
- Remains in force until Contract Completion Certificate

Auditing Body

- Appointed by Employer
- Active during Operation Service
- Totally independent
- Monitor performance of both parties
- No power to 'instruct' or make 'decisions'





Clause 14 Payment

Payment during Design-Build:Similar to the Yellow Book provisions10% Retention5% repaid on issue of
Commissioning Certificate
5% repaid 12 months later (at end of
Retention Period)

Payment during Operation Service:

Based on fee installments given in the Schedule of Payments





"Asset Replacement Fund"

To provide funds for essential replacements during the Operation Service.

Based on an agreed schedule prepared by Contractor Does not include items which are the responsibility of the Contractor:

- Regular maintenance and correction of defects
- Replacement of spares
- Other items identified in the Contract





"Maintenance Retention Fund"

The "Maintenance Retention Fund" is required to provide an incentive to the Contractor to ensure that the Works are in proper condition at the end of the Operation Service Period.

Any money not used is returned to the Contractor at the end of the Contract.





Termination by the Employer - Clause 15

During Design-Build

- For Contractor's Default
- For Employer's Convenience

During Operation Service

- For Contractor's Default
- For Employer's Convenience

Employer cannot continue with Operation after termination for convenience.

Contractor receives full compensation





Suspension and Termination by the Contractor Clause 16

Suspension during Design-Build

- If Employer's Rep. fails to issue payment certificate
- If the Employer fails to pay

Termination during Design-Build

Listed defaults of the Employer

During Operation Service

• The same rights as during Design-Build





The flow from Risk to Insurance is:

- » Risk
- » Responsibility
- » Liability
- » Indemnity
- » Insurance





New Approach in DBO Document

- Different Risks during Design-Build and Operation Service
- Risks of Physical Loss or Damage
- Risks of Financial or Time Loss
- Unidentified Risks
- Both Employer's Risks and Contractor's Risks are addressed





New Simplified Terminology

Claims, Disputes and Arbitration - Clause 20

During the Design-Build Period:

Similar to other FIDIC Documents, but based on Standing DAB with appointment from Commencement to issue of Commissioning Certificate

During the Operation Service Period: Appointment of an 'ad-hoc' DAB as each dispute arises

Role of Auditing Body:

To monitor performance of both parties, but with no 'decision making' role
