#### Transport

New Delhi is easily accessible by air and has an efficient road and rail network. Air and rail links and two national highways connect New Delhi to other major cities. The Delhi Metro Rail, Delhi Transport Corporation buses, taxis and autorickshaws are the main public transport services available. The conference hotels and the conference venue are a 30-40 minute drive from New Delhi's Indra Ghandi International Airport and the two main railway stations, New Delhi Station and Nizammuddin Station, are within 15 to 20 minutes driving time.

Participants can arrange with the hotel booking agent ITH for transfers by chauffeur-driven car to and from the Indra Ghandi International Airport, noting that the Hotel Le Méridien, the main conference hotel, includes transfers in some of its special conference rates. All the airport's domestic terminal buildings are located within walking distance of each other and there is a complimentary shuttle bus service every 20 minutes between the domestic and international terminals.

The airport has two taxi operators: Easy Cabs (+91-11-43 43 43 43; located at international and domestic arrivals) and Meru Cabs (+91-11-44 22 44 22; located in domestic arrivals). Booking counters are available inside the arrival halls and payment can be made with credit/debit cards.

The underground rail system, buses and taxis are the main modes of transport in New Delhi. Air-conditioned and non air-conditioned chauffeur-driven cars can be hired from various other car rental agencies. Charges vary according to the type of car, distance and usage. Agencies include Easy Cab and Meru Cab.

The most comfortable way to get around New Delhi is by taxi, which are not hard to find. Yellow-top taxis are readily available and the fare is metered. Rides can be pre-arranged in hotels or found on the city streets. Fares are determined by either meters or negotiation. If choosing to negotiate, make sure to agree on a price before beginning a trip. If a price cannot be agreed upon, take another taxi as there are plenty to choose from. To avoid any misunderstanding, make sure to carry around a map of the city with the desired destination distinctly marked.

#### Travel

India has an extensive network of international and domestic flights. All major airlines fly to Delhi. Domestic air links connect Delhi from all the major cities in the country. Air India, India's national carrier, and two major private airlines, Jet Airways and Kingfisher Airlines, hold the largest market share and serve the main cities, major towns and tourist destinations. There are also many budget carriers, including SpiceJet, Indigo, GoAir, JetLite, and Kingfisher Red.

#### Accompanying Persons Programme

The Accompanying Persons Programme comprises the Welcome Reception (Sunday), Opening Ceremony (Monday) and Gala Dinner (Wednesday).

#### Optional tours and tour organiser's desk

Staff at the conference welcome desk located next to the registration desk will handle inquiries about optional tours, conference events, the Accompanying Persons Programme, and post-conference tours. Tickets for some tours and events will be available for purchase on site. Participants wishing to change bookings should contact the FIDIC 2010 Secretariat. The possibility to change and exchange bookings is limited.

#### Conference coach transfers

Participants wearing conference badges can board coaches that transfer participants between the conference hotels and the conference venue each morning and evening. Coaches are also provided as follows: Sunday evening from the conference hotels other than the Hotel Le Méridien to the Welcome Reception (Hotel Le Méridien), and return; Monday morning - from the conference hotels to the Opening Ceremony at the conference venue (Vigyan Bhawan), and return; Monday evenining - from the conference hotels to the optional Local Colour Night (Taj Palace Hotel Gardens), and return; Wednesday evening - from the conference hotels to the Gala Dinner (Hotel Leela Kempinski), and return.

#### Climate and clothing

The conference takes place at the beginning of autumn in India and although humid, the temperature in New Delhi at this time of the year, is pleasant. The mean temperature during the day is 15 to 28 °C. While light cotton clothing is advisable during excursions and tours, business dress is recommended for conference events.

The FIDIC 2010 Secretariat is unable to handle outgoing communications. These should be sent using a hotel business centre or the Internet Café.

#### Language and translation

The conference language is English. However, the national language is Hindi. Simultaneous translation is not available for the conference sessions. English is commonly used in all business transactions.

#### Indemnity, insurance and security

While every care is taken to ensure a comfortable and pleasant conference, kindly note that the organisers are not responsible for any mishaps during the conference. Participants and accompanying persons are advised to organise their own personal insurance, by taking out whichever insurance they consider necessary. For all events during the conference, the registration fees do not include provision for the insurance of participants against personal accidents, sickness, theft or property damages. It is recommended that they take out medical insurance for the duration of their trip to India. Hepatitis A and typhoid vaccinations are recommended. A Yellow Fever vaccination is required for visitors from yellow fever infected areas. The conference hotels and venue and the venues for social events will provide security arrangements; tour coaches will be accompanied by security personnel.

#### Banking and currency

Most banks are open from 10.00 to 14.00 from Monday to Friday, and some banks offer extended banking hours. India's currency is the Indian Rupee (INR) available in denominations of INR 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 500 and 1000. The conversion rate is approximately 1 USD = INR 46. All international credit cards are widely accepted in major hotels, restaurants, department stores, etc. Facilities for banking and exchanging foreign currency are available at banks and at most hotels. There are also accredited exchange offices in the city. Travellers' cheques are usually accepted in large hotels, some restaurants and major stores. Otherwise, they must be cashed at an exchange office or bank. All banks do not accept travellers' cheques. Foreign currency can be exchanged at exchange offices, banks, hotels and major department stores (always check the exchange rate as it varies greatly). Banks usually offer the best rate of exchange. Airports

and most major hotels provide exchange services and Automatic Teller Machines for cash withdrawals. 24-hour ATM kiosks are also located in major shopping centers and in many neighborhood markets. Foreigners have no restrictions on the amount of foreign currency or travellers' cheques, provided a declaration form is completed on arrival. It is illegal to exchange money through the black market

#### Tipping

Tipping in India is a common practice. In hotels, porters and room service attendants are generally tipped at the end of the stay. However, the amount of tip varies depending on the type of services rendered and the type of establishment. In restaurants, the tip to waiters is around 10-15% of the bill. In major hotels, a service surcharge is added to the bill to tipping is discretionary. Tipping a taxi or three-wheeler driver is common (10% of the fare is reasonable).

#### Drinking water, smoking and local customs

Most of India's tap water is unfit for consumption. Restaurants offer treated drinking water, but it is advisable to drink bottled water (either packaged drinking water or mineral water) from bottles with seals intact. Visitors should be aware of religious and social customs; smoking in public is banned. When visiting temples visitors may be required to remove their footwear and cover their heads.

#### Special meals

Conference lunches and coffee break items will contain no pork or lard; vegetarian food will also be served or indicated as such. For dietary requirements for the optional tours that include meals, please contact the FIDIC 2010 Secretariat. Alcohol-free tables will be available at the Gala Dinner.

#### **Binder and presentations**

A conference handbook is distributed to each participant in the registration pack. It contains the abstracts of presentations and session programmes. All texts and presentations that were supplied by speakers will be available on the conference website, www.fidic2010.org, immediately after the conference.

Supporting materials for FIDIC meetings (agenda, reports, minutes, etc.) are available on the conference website via the conference Diary. Most are publically accessible; some internal documents require a password (available from the FIDIC Secretariat) to access the FIDIC Internal website, www.fidic.ch. Speaker preparation is in Room 312/3, 3rd Floor, Vigyan Bhawan (08.30 - 17.00, Monday to Wednesday, 20 - 22 September 2010). Speakers are asked to check their presentations and presentation slides beforehand and to hand them to the

organisers' assistant in the speakers' preparation room as early as possible on the day of their presentation.

#### Photographs

A photographer will be present at the main events and conference sessions, and participants. Selected photos will be made available for download on the conference website, www.fidic2010.org.

#### Shopping and tax-free shopping

Delhi boasts many exclusive and high-end shopping enclaves as well as more traditional, older shopping areas. DLF Emporio Mall (Vasant Kunj), Select City Walk (Saket), DLF Promenade (Saket) and Ansal Plaza (August Kranti Marg) are among the new shopping destinations in Delhi that feature luxury brands. Janpath, Connaught Place, Chandni Chowk, South Extension, and Khan Market offer more conventional products. Shops are usually open between 11.00 and 19.00.

#### Electricity supply

Electricity in India is 240 Volts/50 Hertz. Outlets generally accept the following types of plugs that have two round pins or three round pins arranged in a triangle.

#### Payphones

Unlocked dual-, tri- or quad-band GSM cell phone that work on 900/1800 MHz can be used in India without paying roaming charges by buying a prepaid SIM card (available at most phone retailers all over the country) for approximately INR100.

#### Taxes

Airport departure taxes may or may not be included in the cost of air tickets. Currently for neighbouring countries the tax is INR 150 and for international departures it is INR 500. The tax on hotel accommodation varies between 5 and 12.5%. Additional taxes on restaurant food and alcohol vary from state to state. Restaurant bills often include additional charges (such as a service tax) of 10-15% of the total cost. Payment by credit cards often attracts a surcharge. Commissioned by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan, builder of the Taj Mahal, and completed in 1656, it is India's largest and best-known mosque; Rajghat, a black marble platform located on the banks of the river Yamuna and marking the spot of Gandhi's cremation on 31 January 1948, is left open to the sky and an eternal flame burns at one end; India Gate stands midway along the Rajpath or "King's Way", New Delhi's ceremonial boulevard that runs from Rashtrapati Bhavan through Vijay Chowk and India Gate to the National Stadium, Delhi.

#### Monday, September 20 – Three-Quarter Day Tour: Sanskriti Kendra

11.00-17.00: coaches leave from the conference venue, the Vigyan Bhawan, and return to the conference hotels. Tour includes lunch.

Visits to the Sanskriti Kendra and the Cottage Industries that allow participants to come into close contact with India's remarkable handicraft traditions. The tour starts with a visit to the Sanskriti Kendra, an artist village complex spread over eight acres, that houses the Museum of Everyday Art, the Museum of Indian Terracotta and the Textile Museum. It is located on the foothills of the Aravali Mountains on the outskirts of New Delhi. After lunch, participants visit the Central Cottage Industries Emporium, established in 1950, that has played a crucial role in preserving Indian handicrafts. By nurturing a rich 5000year old cultural heritage and showcasing the work of craftsmen, weavers and folk artists from throughout India, the "Cottage Emporium" unfolds a rich saga of breathtaking masterpieces by skilled artisans.

#### Tuesday, September 21 – Morning Tour: Qutab Minar and Lotus Temple

09.00 - 12.30: coaches leave from Vigyan Bhawan and return to the conference hotels (coaches from conference hotels to Vigyan Bhawan at 08.00 - 08.30).

Guided tours of the Qutub Minar and the Lotus Temple testify to India's rich religious traditions. The Qutub Minar, the world's tallest brick minaret, forms part of the Qutub complex amidst the ruins of ancient Hindu and Jain temples which were destroyed to build the complex. The Qutub Minar is notable for being one of the earliest and most prominent examples of Indo-Islamic architecture. The Bahá'í House, popularly known as the Lotus Temple owing to its flowerlike shape, is a

prominent Delhi attraction. Completed in 1986 is serves as the Bahá'í religion's mother temple for the Indian subcontinent. The temple with its nine surrounding ponds occupies over 26 acres.

Tuesday, September 21 – Afternoon Tour: **Humayun's Tomb & National Museum** 14.30 - 18.00: coaches leave from the Hotel Le Méridien and return to the conference hotels.

Guided tours of Humayun's Tomb and the National Museum. Humayun's Tomb comprises a complex of buildings built as the Mughal Emperor Humayun's tomb, that was commissioned by his wife Hamida Banu Begum in 1562. The National Museum on the corner of Janpath and Maulana Azad Road and adjaent to the Vigyan Bhawan, the conference venue, has over 200,000 items ranging from the pre-historic artifacts to modern works of art, mainly from India and central Asia. The museum features splendid chronological displays of selected art objects in several galleries.

#### Wednesday, September 22 - Morning Tour: Akshardham

09.00 - 13.30: coaches leave from the Vigyan Bhawan and return to the conference hotels (coaches from conference hotels to Vigyan Bhawan at 08.00 - 08.30).

A visit to the massive and awesome Akshardham Temple Monument to World Peace that was inaugurated in 2005. It is often invoked as a modern-day wonder of the world – a miracle worked by the sacrifice of thousands of volunteers. The temple was built by the foundation that has built the various Swaminaryan temples across the world. It is a place of education, entertainment and enlightenment that leads to a powerful experience of Indian culture and an unique insight into Hinduism.

#### Wednesday, September 22 - Afternoon Tour: Dilli Haat

14.30 - 17.00: coaches leave from the Hotel Le Méridien and return to the conference hotels.

A visit to Dilli Haat, a beautiful Indian crafts and food market and a true shopper's paradise that is located in the heart of Delhi. It has been deliberately made to resemble a traditional weekly village market, or haat. Small thatched roof cottages with a village atmosphere give it great ambiance. The market offers an exciting blend of handicrafts, food, and cultural activities. There are over 200 stalls with craftsmen displaying their wares from all over India. Some 25 food stalls serve a variety of India's many regional specialties.

#### Thursday, September 23 – Day Tour: Agra Experience

07.00 - 17.30; coaches leave from the Hotel Le Méridien and return to the conference hotels.

Taking air-conditioned luxury coaches, there is a short stop at the tomb of Akbar the Great, an important Mughal architectural masterpiece built 1605-1613 and set in 120 acres of grounds in Sikandra, a suburb of Agra. Then visit the Taj Mahal, the world famous heritage site that is considered the finest example of Mughal architecture which combines elements from Persian, Indian and Islamic architectural styles. Following lunch at the Mughal Sheraton Hotel there is a guided tour of the Agra Fort, or more accurately a 94-acre walled palatial city, the most important fort in India, from which the Mughal emperors ruled India.

#### Friday, September 24 - Two-Day Tour: Forts and Palaces of Jaipur

Coaches leave from the Hotel Le Méridien at 07.00 on Friday, 24 September, and return to the conference hotels at 17.30 on Saturday, 25 September.

Taking air-conditioned luxury coaches, drive to Jaipur (the "Pink City") and check in at the five-star Rajputana Sheraton Hotel. Then enjoy a sightseeing tour of the City Palace (a palace complex that includes the Chandra Mahal and Mubarak Mahal palaces), Hawa Mahal and the Jantar Mantar. Overnight accommodation is provided in Jaipur and participants are at their leisure. On the second day, take a guided tour of the Amber Fort that includes an elephant ride and visits to the Jaipur markets. Caoches return to New Delhi in the afternoon
