


## Gold & Bronze Books

# NEW CASE STUDIES OF FIDIC APPLICATION BY USERS

## Mega Power Plant Project in South Africa

Alain Meric, Group Director for Large Projects at Vallourec (France) will present an insightful case study based on his direct experience of using the FIDIC Yellow Book in the construction of a mega power plant in South Africa. His presentation will provide an explanation of modified or additional clauses in the FIDIC Yellow Book and well as present the issues encountered in executing the contract from a Contractor's perspective, as well as Subcontracting aspects. Not to be missed!



## Railway Projects in Turkey Under FIDIC and EU PRAG Transparency Rules

Alfonso Pelosi, Contract Management FIDIC and EU PRAG Senior Expert at IRD Engineering (Italy) shares his experience of implementing of a Red Book work contract co-financed by the EU, together with its relevant service contract, in the framework of the European Union rules and boundaries. Themes under examination include the harmonization of the FIDIC concepts and the PRAG procedures as well as the difficulties faced by the Employer.



## Irish Water Use of the FIDIC Gold Book

Jacqueline Masterson, a senior projects lawyer in Irish Water is a key member of the team that developed FIDIC Gold for use on Irish Water's current capital investment programme, which anticipates c. €1.3b expenditure on major projects, including c.167 DBO treatment plant contracts. Jacqueline will share her preliminary findings on the experience and share considerations that will no doubt resonate with other users in attendance.



## International Project for the Construction of a Nuclear Fusion Reactor (France)

Having focused on some aspects FIDIC use in the ITER fusion reactor project last year we have once again asked Fusion for Energy to come along and talk us through all the important aspects of the project, which we didn't have the time to cover in 2014. Chris Guirado of F4E will review the changes made to the FIDIC standard forms (Red and Yellow books) including variations, design liability, the Engineer's role and dispute resolution and provide feedback from contract administration.

09:50 **FIDIC's Update of the 1999 Yellow Book: Potential Proposed Changes That are Currently under 'Friendly Review'**

The FIDIC 1999 Suite of Contracts (Red Book, Yellow Book and Silver Book) are currently being updated by FIDIC. While all the updated contracts will be published together at the same time, FIDIC has been working first on updating the Yellow Book with the plan to continue then with harmonised update work on the Red Book and the Silver Book. Having been carefully considered by FIDIC's Contracts Committee and Special Advisors, in Autumn of 2015 the proposed update of the Yellow Book (marked up with proposed changes to the Yellow Book 1999) was distributed to selected distinguished construction and legal professionals for their review and constructive comments. While it may be the case that not all FIDIC's proposed changes will survive such rigorous scrutiny, this session will give an outline of the main proposed changes to the Yellow Book 1999 contract that may appear in the updated Yellow Book when it is published.

11:30 **The Golden Principles of FIDIC Conditions of Contracts – What makes FIDIC Unique?**

FIDIC's 1999 suite of contracts have generally been used with great success in many projects. They are perceived as International Best Practice. Obviously, "using FIDIC conditions of contracts" has never been a guarantee for ultimate success - especially, if the actual conditions depart significantly from FIDIC's basic principles! In more extreme cases, projects which have failed show substantial misuse of FIDIC contracts. This interactive session aims to analyse what would be the most appropriate ways (if any) to avoid misuse of FIDIC contracts and what limits there might be for FIDIC to prevent such misuse to its standardised contracts. Examples will be provided of FIDIC being modified because of Public Law and how this impacts negatively on projects. How can the industry deal with this? Insights will be offered from personal experience, as well as an outline of specific initiatives aimed at dealing with this problem.

- What are the so called "golden principles" imbedded in the 1999 Forms?

**FIDIC Integrity Management System (FIMS): New Guidelines**

As a companion document to the FIDIC Integrity Management System (or FIMS) Guidelines Part I – Policies and Principles, 1st Ed 2011, a Part II - Procedures document has been recently published. FIMS Part II is a document designed to assist consulting firms, regardless of size or home country, in the development of a framework to manage and mitigate bribery and corruption risks that may be encountered in the business environments that many companies face today. The document comprises two sections: the first one is conceptual and presents a unified view of risk areas regarding integrity and how firms could take preventive actions; the second one includes some sample forms which illustrate how different companies are addressing integrity issues in their day-to-day business operations.

**The Engineer's Roles and Risks Under FIDIC Contracts**

This session will look at the key aspects of the role of the Engineer under FIDIC Works Contracts and highlight the main risks faced by the Engineer, the negative impacts of which are often Employer-driven without the Employer necessarily realising it. Coverage includes:

- The key Role of the Engineer in the FIDIC system
