He is currently visiting Professor at Trinity College, Dublin University and a FIDIC Accredited Trainer. He is Past President of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators Worldwide and of the Association of Consulting Engineers of Ireland. He is a Special Advisor of FIDIC's Contracts Committee; and a member of groups of the Commission on International Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce, Paris including the Forum on ADR; the Construction Arbitration Working Group and the Governing Board of the International Council for Commercial Arbitration.

Dr. Bunni is a Fellow of the Irish Academy of Engineering. He is past Chairman of FIDIC's Standing Committee on Professional Liability and FIDIC's Task Committee on Construction, Insurance and Law. He is author of “Construction Insurance and the Irish Conditions of Contract”; “Risk and Insurance in Construction”; “The FIDIC Forms of Contract”; and numerous technical papers.

He has acted as arbitrator, conciliator/mediator or DAB in fifty jurisdictions, having been appointed arbitrator in numerous cases of dispute with values exceeding £450 million.
