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### OVERVIEW

FIDIC Conditions of Contract are now increasingly used in infrastructure projects throughout the world. The three courses have been designed to offer a complete and effective understanding on the management of contract claims, the working of Dispute Adjudication Boards and the basic form of appointments between a Client and the Consultant.

While Module 2 provides practical advice to those working with the FIDIC Conditions of Contract in the management of claims, understanding, defending and achieving the resolution of disputes, Module 3 is designed to provide an in-depth understanding and working of Dispute Adjudication Boards and Arbitration and Module 0 is intended for general use for purposes of pre-investment and feasibility studies, designs and administration of construction and project management, with both for employer-led design teams and for contractor-led design teams under the Design and Build Procurement.

The courses are also accredited by the Engineers Registration Board of Tanzania and participants will be awarded 6.5 CPD Points for Module 0 and 13.0 CPD Points for either Module 2 or Module 3.

### **COURSE TUTOR**

He is highly qualified and experienced in the use of FIDIC Contracts and has been involved in various infrastructure projects in Africa, the Middle East, South East Asia and Europe. Dr. Hoek is a specialist in International Contract Law, Construction law and International Litigation. He is an Arbitrator, Adjudicator and is listed in the FIDIC President's List of Approved Dispute Adjudicators.

### **REGISTRATION AND COURSE FEE**

Early bird fee for Module 0 is USD 400.00. A delegate who registers for Module 2 and Module 3 will pay USD 1,500.00 while a delegate attending all three courses pays USD 1,900.00. Firms that sponsor above 5 delegates and all attending two or more courses receive a discount of 10%. Delegates can also pay in local currency using the exchange rate applicable on the day of payment.
