OVERVIEW:

The 1999 FIDIC Conditions of Contract are being increasingly used by the international Construction Industry throughout the World. The Multi-Lateral Development Banks, including the World Bank, Inter - American Development Bank & Caribbean Development Bank have adopted the 1999 FIDIC Conditions of Contract for Construction with modifications known as Harmonised Construction Contract.

Module 4: It explains and illustrates the use of the FIDIC Conditions of Contract for Construction (the "Construction Contract") and the FIDIC Conditions of Contract for Plant and Design-Build (the "Design-Build Contract"). The course is designed to help the participants have confidence in working with these documents whether representing Employers, Consultants or Contractors.

Module 3: It clearly explains the procedures and application of the Dispute Adjudication requirements under these contracts, providing a comprehensive understanding of DAB processes and procedures, together with in-depth practical knowledge and problem solving scenarios.
