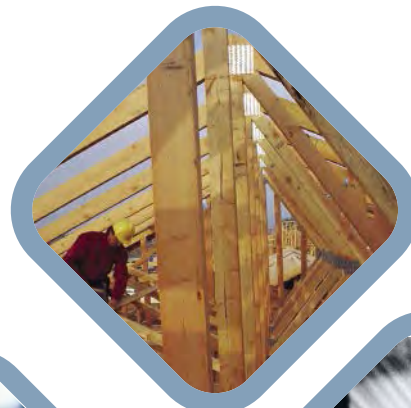

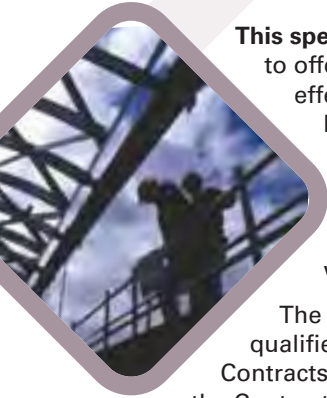

He is previous co-chair of the International Construction Projects committee of the International Bar Association and is a member of the Working Group of FIDIC which drafted the Short Form of Contract and the Dredging Contract. Corbett & Co is an affiliate member of FIDIC.

Prof. Dr. Nael G. Bunni is a Chartered Engineer, Registered Chartered Arbitrator and

Conciliator. He is currently Visiting Professor at Trinity College, Dublin University. He is Past President of the Chartered Institute & Arbitrators Worldwide and of the Association of Consulting Engineers of Ireland. At present, he is a Special Advisor of FIDIC's Contracts Committee; and a member of various groups of the Commission on International Arbitration of the International Chamber of Commerce, Paris and its fora including the Forum on ADR; the Construction Arbitration Working Group and the Governing Board of the International Council for Commercial Arbitration.

In 1999, Dr Bunni was elected a Fellow of the Irish Academy of Engineering and in March 2000 he

was elected a member of the International Council for Commercial Arbitration, 'ICCA'. He is past Chairman of FIDIC's Standing Committee on Professional Liability and FIDIC's Task Committee on Construction, Insurance and Law. At present he is a member or chairman of a number of technical committees in Dubai, USA, Ireland, Switzerland, Austria and Beijing.

He has acted as arbitrator, conciliator/mediator or DAB in fifty jurisdictions, having been appointed arbitrator in numerous cases of dispute with values exceeding £450 million, either as sole arbitrator or as a member of a tribunal or as a chairman of an arbitral tribunal.

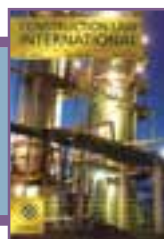
