COURSE RECOGNITION:

COURSE TUTOR

His publications include translations (into German and French) of FIDIC Conditions of Contract (Red, Yellow and Pink Books) and Relationship between FIDIC Conditions of Contract and public procurement law - reliability of Tender Documents. Dr. Hoek is a law lecturer and senior partner of Rechtswalt, a law firm in Berlin.



REGISTRATION AND ATTENDANCE FEE
